Travel Guide to the City

-Dublin Airport Toward City Centre Dublin Express Coach

- When arriving to Dublin Airport passengers will enter through one of 2 terminals, Terminal 1 or Terminal 2. The arriving terminal will depend on departing country or airline. Dublin Airport has a comprehensive bus network running 15 bus stops for pickups into Dublin City Centre and the Suburban Dublin area. Bus stops for pickups are located outside of both terminals. Operating buses are Dublin Express, Air Coach, DublinBus and TFI.
- Dublin Express Service routes to city centre are: 782 servicing stops between Georges Quay and Custom House Quay turning back to Dublin Alrpory at Heuston Train Station. Heuston Train Station allows for transfers for rail routes servicing Ireland, routes included but not limited to are Galway City, Limerick City & Belfast. Bus transfers for county travel are available at this point also along with Red Line Luas Tram Services.
- Route 784 from Dublin Airport servicing stops between Georges Quay to Hardcourt Street via Trinity College. Transfers for Green line Luas Tram Services can be taken here for routes continuing out to greater Dublin Suburban areas.
- 782 & 784 Bus services are best direct options for visitors to The Spencer Hotel and stopping at stop number 7397 (North Wall Quay) located just outside the hotel. Buses run at regular 30-minute intervals (off peek). Tickets for bus services can

Why choose public transport ahead of private?

Studies have shown that taking public transport as a primary method has significant effects for our own health as well as the environment. Bus travel is a more environmentally friendly option compared to individual car travel. Buses have a higher passenger capacity, meaning they can transport a larger number of people using less fuel per person. This helps reduce carbon emissions and contributes to the preservation of the environment.

Public transport is good for our health. Studies have show by taking public transport it can have a positive effect on our own health and wellbeing by limiting stress that can be associated with driving, encourages activity by walking and reduces emissions output which leads to less air pollution we breath in.

Departure – From City Centre to Dublin Airport

When needing to sadly depart from a special trip away, the hotel is perfectly situated for airport transfers with Dublin Express. With the pickup stop for airport returns less than 100 meters from The Spencer Hotel front door, visitors need not worry about carrying luggage through busy metropolitan crowds whilst attempting to navigate unfamiliar streets. The North Wall Quay bus stop 7397, located outside of the AIG building is the final stop for pickups on route to Dublin Airport and less than 30 minutes of travel time. This method offers a low cost, delay free, eco-friendly and sustainable travel option for all visitors. Additionally bus and coach services into Dublin Airport drop-off zones take priority and is rarely delayed by traffic congestion around the airport access routes, reducing the potential for delays to passengers arriving.



The Luas Tram Service

The Luas electronic tram service (Red Line) is the most efficient way to access Dublin City sights. Located to the rear of the hotel within a short 3-minute walk to the "Mayor Square" platform. The tram will take commuters directly into the heart of the city centre and the connection for trains & buses to the greater Dublin area and Irish countryside. The trams run every 5-10 minutes during peak travel hours and 10-20 minutes off peak.

Tram tickets can be purchased at the platform. Multiple ticket options are available 1 way, Return, 1 week, 1 day flexi (all day use)
Tickets can be purchased using cash or a card.

Transfers

Tram transfers to destinations not serviced on the red line are at Abbey street station, commuters can cross over to green line services.


Transfers for dart services to coastal locations such as Bray and Howth are at Connelly Train Station via Busaras Luas stop.

Transfers for Train services for departures outside of Dublin are at Connelly via Busaras and Heuston (Station depending on location intended to travel)



Bus Network

The use of the Luas tram service may not be suitable for some tourist destinations in Dublin City Center or the greater Dublin area. There are multiple bus stops located in the immediate vicinity of the hotel servicing many central areas in the city, northern coastal areas of Dublin County and intercounty buses. The local stops are at the doorstep of the hotel allowing for easy travel for visitors for airport transfers, express peak hour transport and standard service buses. These services are cost effective, ecofriendly and have priority as they travel through bus corridors and specially designed streets assigned to bus only restrictions thus avoiding congestion delays. Routes serviced by several providers such as DublinBus (blue & yellow), TFI (green & yellow), Swords Express (White) and Dublin Express (Airport). Our front office team are on hand to assist with the best suggested bus routes for destinations outside of the tram service. Please note a short tram trip may be required to link up to some bus routes.

Servicing Busses

- Number 60 servicing to red cow through the heart of city centre passing tourist attractions such as Dublin Castle and Christ Church Cathedral
- Number 142 Servicing University College Dublin, RDS Events Hall and American Embassy
- Number 740 Servicing County Wexford in the South of Ireland
- Number G1 24 Hour Express service to Red Cow Luas Station allowing for transfers for suburban areas outside of County Dublin.
- Number G2 24 Hour Express service to Liffey Valley and Lucan allowing for transfers to suburban areas outside of County Dublin such as Maynooth, Lexlip and Cellbridge
- Number 500/500N/500x/501 Swords Express Servicing Swords area including Airside Business Park which has a number of Multinational offices in Aviation
- Number 33d Serving Portrane and coastal areas north Dublin County -Including Donabate Beech and Portrane Beech. Along this route will open coastal walking trails are available for tourists to explore.
- Dublin Express Servicing the Airport with buses every 20/30 minutes.

The Spencer Hotel recommends the purchase of a Visitor leap card. These cards come in the in 3 possible options 1 day, 3 day, 7 day cards depending on length of travel and choice. Leap cards can be used on all public transport services at a discount to standard fares including DART Rail services. Information can be found at Leap Card. Available to purchase online or at selected store agents.

Should your stay exceed the visitor day limit of 7 days, Physical top up leap cards can be purchased at most convenience stores nationwide. The card is purchased and can be and topped up by purchaser with no limitations. Information can be found at <u>Leap</u> Card.

Leap cards should only be purchased off licensed stores or through the Leap card website.










THE TUK TUK



As the docklands events scene continues to thrive year on year with concerts, comedy shows and a mix of other events the popularity of the Tuk Tuk grows.

Drivers gather along north wall quay to offer event goers a trip to the hosting event venues at a reasonable cost. Tuk Tuk 's offer a unique sort of fun as they generally are only out during specific periods or events.

Powered by a mix of pedal and battery the Tuk Tuk's produce 0 emissions when moving. Although they are not a common day to day sustainable travel option, one thing is for sure when they are available, they are great "craic". Just ask Belinda our local Tuk Tuk driver familiar to The Spencer Hotel team

Some Background

While many offer compelling claims, the origins of the first tuk-tuk remains disputed. In 1886 a group of Germans placed a patent for a three-wheeled vehicle closely resembling the modern-day tuk-tuk minus the engine, while some claim the Italians created the first tuk-tuk in 1947 with the Piaggio Ape.

WALKING

The Spencer hotel is located just a short distance from the hustle and bustle of Dublin City Centre. With several local attractions such as Epic Museum and The Jeanie Johnston telling the story of Irelands famine history nearby.

Only a 20-minute walk to the Famous Temple bar district of Dublin providing traditional Irish entertainment as well as cuisine and of course plenty of Guinness.

In our commitment to be more environmentally friendly, when booking taxis our front office team will select the eco-friendly option for taxi on the Freeenow app. E vehicles will be selected as a standard. The request for this vehicle type will be offered out to the nearest taxi driver, should a taxi not be available the booking app will then go to the next best available option.
